## Foreign students face crisis at Harvard

- Harvard University is one of the best schools in the world. The school is very difficult to enter and has a very high level of education.
- 2 But now, international students at Harvard are facing a serious crisis. President Donald Trump has frozen Harvard's ability to accept new international students. This means foreign students cannot study at Harvard for now.
- If this really happens, more than 6,000 foreign students may lose their visas and have to leave the U.S. Harvard University says that the action is unfair and against the law. The school went to court, and a judge stopped the order for now. But the future is still unclear.
- Many students are worried or angry. They ask, "Will I be sent home?" "Can I finish my degree?" They also say, <u>①"We feel like we're being used as pawns in a game."</u> Harvard now has about 260 Japanese students and researchers. In 2023, more than 13,500 Japanese students studied in the U.S. Japanese students also study in Australia, South Korea, Canada, Taiwan, and the U.K, but the U.S. has the largest number.
