José Mujica: The World's Poorest President

- José Mujica, the former president of Uruguay, passed away on May 13 at the age of 89. He was known around the world as "the world's poorest president" because of his simple lifestyle.
- Though he was president, he lived on a small farm, drove an old car, and donated 90% of his salary to charity. He believed that living simply gave him more freedom and peace.
- Mujica was Uruguay's president from 2010 to 2015. During this time, he worked hard to make people's lives better. He raised the minimum wage and started housing programs for poor families. As a result, the poverty rate of Uruguay went down from 18.5% to 9.8%.
- [4] He also focused on promoting the use of renewable energy, including hydropower, solar power, wind power, biomass energy, and geothermal energy. Thanks to his efforts, about 98% of Uruguay's electricity now comes from these clean energy sources.
- [5] Many people respected Mujica. Even after his death, his words and actions continue to inspire people around the world.
